THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 34 of 1933.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Real Property Ordinance 1925-1933.

BE it ordained by the Governor General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Real Property Ordinance* (No. 2) 1933. Short title and citation.

(2.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the *Real Property Ordinance 1933* is repealed.

(3.) The *Real Property Ordinance 1925-1930*, as amended by the *Real Property Ordinance 1933*, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Real Property Ordinance 1925-1933*.

2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced on the sixteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three. Commencement.

3. Section one hundred and thirty-eight A of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:— Appointment of new or additional trustees.

“(2.) Upon the entry being made, the new trustee, the continuing trustees, or the continuing trustees and the new trustee or the additional trustee, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be the registered proprietor or proprietors of the land, estate or interest, and as such to be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance as if he or they were the trustee or trustees originally registered as proprietor or proprietors of the land, estate or interest.”
