3		This Act is the Liquor Amendment Act 2001.

5		This Act commences on the day it is notified in the Gazette.

10	159	Evidence that liquids are liquor
11 12 13	(1)	If an information for an offence against a provision of this Act states that a substance is liquor, the statement is evidence that the substance is liquor within the meaning of the provision.
14	(2)	This section has effect whether or not a sample of the liquid—
15		(a) has been taken; or
16		(b) has been given to the defendant; or
17		(c) has been subject to chemical or any other analysis.
18 19	(3)	This section does not apply to a proceeding begun before the commencement of this section.
20 21	(4)	Subsection (3) and this subsection expire 2 years after their commencement.
22 23		<i>Note</i> The expiry of a transitional provision does not end its continued effect—see <i>Legislation Act 2001</i> , s 82, def of <i>repeal</i> and s 88 (1).
