A BILL

FOR

An Act to require the publication of certain executive documents

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Executive Documents Release Act 2000.

5 2 Commencement

This Act commences on a day fixed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.

Note 1 The provisions of an Act providing for its name and commencement automatically commence on the date of notification of the Act (see *Interpretation Act* 1967, s 10B).

Note 2 A single day or time may be fixed, or different days or times may be fixed for different provisions (see *Interpretation Act 1967*, s 10C (1)).

Note 3 If a provision has not commenced within 6 months beginning on the date of notification of the Act, it automatically commences on the first day after that period (see *Interpretation Act 1967*, s 10E (2)).

3 Definitions

In this Act, the following definitions apply:

Assembly means the Legislative Assembly or a committee of the Legislative Assembly nominated by the Speaker for this Act.

10 Executive includes a committee of the Executive.

executive document means-

- (a) an official record of a meeting of the Executive; or
- (b) a document that was-
 - (i) formally submitted by a Minister to a meeting of the Executive for its consideration in relation to a matter on the official record; and
 - (ii) created for that purpose; or
- (c) part of a document mentioned in paragraph (a) or (b).

release day, of an executive document-

- (a) if no determination under section 6 or 7 applies to the document—the *release day* is the later of—
 - (i) the 11 May of the 11th calendar year after the calendar year of the submission day; and
 - (ii) the day 8 weeks after the commencement of this Act; and
- (b) if a determination under section 6 or 7 applies to the document— the *release day* is the day set by that section.

submission day, of an executive document, means the day of the meeting of the Executive to which the document relates.

5 An executive document must be released on its release day

The chief executive must arrange for the public release of an executive document on its release date.

6 Release day may be delayed in the public interest

- 5 (1) Before the release day of an executive document (the *current* release day), the chief executive must assess whether it contains any information that would, if released on the current release day—
 - (a) adversely affect relations with the government of the Commonwealth or of a State; or
 - (b) be significantly detrimental to the public interest or the interests of the Territory.
 - (2) If the chief executive is satisfied that it does contain such information, he or she may determine that the part of the document that contains the information (the *excluded part*) has a later release day.
- 15 (3) The determination must—

- (a) state the reasons for making the determination; and
- (b) specify the later release day for the excluded part, or the way in which a release day is to be calculated.
- (4) A copy of the determination must be kept with the excluded part, and be released with it on its release day.
 - (5) The determination takes effect immediately before the current release day.
 - (6) The determination—
 - (a) must be laid before the Assembly within 6 sitting days after the current release day; and
 - (b) ceases to have effect 3 months after the current release day if it is not ratified by a resolution of the Assembly.
 - (7) The release day of the excluded part is the earliest of the following:
 - (a) the release day in accordance with the determination;
 - (b) the day 5 years after the current release day;
 - (c) the 11 May of the calendar year 21 years after the calendar year of the submission day of the excluded part;
 - (d) if the determination ceases to have effect because of paragraph (6)(b)—the day it ceases to have effect.

7 Protection of individual privacy

- (1) Before the release day of an executive document (the *current release day*), the chief executive must assess whether it contains any information that would, if released on the current release day, constitute an unreasonable breach of an individual's privacy.
- (2) If the chief executive is satisfied that it does contain such information, he or she may determine that the part of the document that contains the information (the *excluded part*)—
 - (a) has a later release day; or
- (b) is not an executive document.
- (3) The determination must state the reasons for making the determination.
- (4) A copy of the determination must be kept with the excluded part.
- (5) If the excluded part remains an executive document—
 - (a) the determination must specify the later release date for the excluded part, or the way in which a release date is to be calculated; and
 - (b) the determination must be released with the document on its release day; and
 - (c) its release day is the release day in accordance with the direction.

8 No liability for complying with Act

The Territory is not liable to any person for anything done in good faith to comply with this Act.

9 Regulation-making powers

The Executive may make regulations for this Act.
