Ainslie Transfer Station Bill 1990

A BILL

FOR

An Act to re-establish the Ainslie Transfer Station

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts
as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Ainslie Transfer Station Act 1990*.

5 **Commencement**

2. This Act commences on the day on which it is notified in the *Gazette*.

Interpretation

- 10 3. In this Act, "Ainslie Transfer Station" means the site in Block 2 Section 55 Hackett at the southern terminus of Phillip Avenue which has been operated by the Territory as a domestic waste collection depot.

Operation of Ainslie Transfer Station

4. (1) The Ainslie Transfer Station shall be reopened and operated by the Territory for the deposit, free of charge, by any resident of the

Territory, of domestic waste, and its subsequent transfer to landfill sites or recycling facilities.

(2) The Ainslie Transfer Station shall contain facilities for the separate collection of recyclable material. Such separate facilities shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) paper products;
- (b) brown glass;
- (c) green glass;
- (d) clear glass;
- (e) plastics; and
- (f) compostable material.

Hours of operation

5. (1) Subject to subsection (2) the Ainslie Transfer Station shall be open for operation every day for not less than the hours of 8.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

(2) The Ainslie Transfer Station shall not be open for operation on Good Friday or Christmas Day.

Application to the Crown

6. This Act binds the Crown.

Standing

7. Any resident of the Territory may bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enforce any right created by this Act.
