An Act to amend the Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Act 2008

		This Act is the Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Amendment Act 2008.
2		Commencement
	(1)	This Act (other than section 5) commences on the day after its notification day.
	(2)	Section 5 commences on the commencement of the <i>Road Transport</i> (<i>Third-Party Insurance</i>) <i>Act 2008</i> , section 86 (Time for giving notice of claim—nominal defendant).
		Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).
