#### A Bill for

An Act to amend the Government Procurement Act 2001, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

  - (a) the date the payment was authorised by the Treasurer;
  - (b) the date of the payment;
  - (c) the amount of the payment;

2	(e) the directorate or territory authority that made the payment;
3	(f) anything else prescribed by regulation.
4 (5) 5	The register may include anything else the director-general considers appropriate.
6 (6) 7 8	The responsible directorate or territory authority for an act of grace payment must, within 21 days after the end of the quarter in which the payment was made—
9 10	(a) enter the information mentioned in subsection (4) for the payment in the register; or
11 12	(b) give the information to the director-general for entry in the register.
