NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Kelleway Avenue	Charles Kelleway (1889-1944)	A right-handed batsman and skilled bowler, he played in 26 test matches between 1912 and 1929 and 39 Sheffield Shield matches. During his first class career from 1907-28 he made 6,389 runs including 15 centuries, and took 339 wickets.
McAuliffe Court	Flourence Joseph McAuliffe (1840-1886)	A Blacksmith and Pioneer in the Gungahlin area. He arrived in Australia with his parents on the ship 'Herald' in 1845. He married Mary Anne Flanagan and was blacksmith at Ginninderra for several years until 1876. He was instrumental in having St Francis Catholic Church built at Ginninderra in 1872.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Ebeling Court	Hans Ebeling (1905-1980)	A right arm, fast medium bowler and useful batsman, he represented Victoria for years. He toured New Zealand with his state side in 1924-25 and while touring England with the Australian team in 1934 he appeared in one Test Match at the Oval. During his first class career 1923-37 he made 1,005 runs and took 217 wickets.
Gardyne Place	Claude Gardyne (1882-1933)	He was on the staff of the Sydney Sports Ground for many years. He trained cyclists and worked with the sculler James Paddon. He was responsible for the pre-war success of track and field teams for the South Sydney Amateur Athletic Club.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Tubman Place	Ken Tubman (1916-1993)	He was one of the best-known early rally drivers in the world. He drove rally cars for more than 40 years and two of his major achievements included winning the first Redex trial in 1953, and winning the Special World Cup Rally in 1970. The Maitland City Council honoured him in 1988 when it named a 28 million dollar city by-pass after him in recognition of national and international achievements in rally car driving.
Evan Place	Griffith Mostyn Evan (1861-1924)	Sportsman. Born in SA in 1861. He helped organise intercollegiate sports in 1898 and was councillor of the Adelaide Cricket Ground from 1908-10 and President of the South Australian Cricket Association in 1920. The member's stand at the Adelaide Oval was named after him.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Serisier Close	Frederick Achille Serisier (1867-1928)	Sportsman. Born in Busselton in WA. He was an international rugby footballer and enthusiastic cricketer from Dubbo to the Victoria Goldfields.
Oldershaw Court	William James Oldershaw (1856-1926)	Rifle Shooter. He was a member of the Victorian Rifle Association and won the Queens Prize in Melbourne in 1882. He was Chairman of the National Rifle Association in NSW from 1886-1904. He was Captain of the Australian Team which won the Kolapore Cup in 1903.
Monfries Place	John Elliot Monfries (1873-1954)	Sportsman. Born in Gumeracha, SA. He played cricket for NSW from 1907-08 and later played interstate baseball.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Hellings Place	John Henry Hellings (1875-1931)	Swimmer. He learned to swim at Domain Baths where he won three championships in 1892. He won the Australasian 100 and 200 yard titles in 1896 and dead heated in the English Championships in 1897. He also won titles in Europe and he played water polo for England in 1898-99.
Whatmore Court	George Willoughby Whatmore (1868-1929)	Sportsman. Born in Sydney, NSW. He was prominent in rowing, yachting and cycling. He rode from Adelaide to Sydney on a 'Penny-Farthing' and represented NSW in cycle racing. He was founder of the Sydney Motor Boat Club and later the Royal Motor Yacht Club.


