

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Candlebark Close	Australian flora: Candlebark	Candlebark name used in the timber trade for the white-boled <i>Eucalyptus</i> <i>Rubida</i> .
Lyrebird Place	Australian Fauna: Lyrebird	Australia has two species of lyrebird - the Superb Lyrebird and the Albert Lyrebird.
Platypus Place	Australian Fauna: Platypus	There are only two animal species that make up the monotreme family - they are the platypus and the echidna
Bilby Place	Australian Fauna: Bilby	Rabbit-eared bandicoot, known also as the Dalgyte or Bilby, native to Australia.
Numbat Place	Australian Fauna: Numbat	Australian marsupial, threatened with extinction.
