

STREET NOMENCLATURE

Division of Nicholls: Sports People

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Cecins Place	Bernie Cecins (1929-1986)	Sports Commentator. Born in Latvia he arrived in Western Australia in 1950. Selected in the state team as a Javelin Thrower in 1952. The first recipient of the WA Athletics Association Merit Award. Reported for the "West Australian" for 25 years and was sports commentator for the ABC for 30 years.
Hendry Close	Hunter (Stork) Scott Thomas Laurie Hendry (1895-1988)	Cricketer. Represented Australia in 11 tests between 1921 and 1929. Selected for the 1921 tour of England where he played the first four tests. Highest score was 325 when playing for Victoria in 1926-27. His only test century was made against England in 1928-29.
Peken Place	Charles Francis Peken (c. 1887-1910)	Jockey. Born Whittlesea, Victoria, he moved to Western Australia in 1900. A a popular jockey who rode many races for the Le Var Stables, also a member of the W.A. Ascot Cricket Club. He was killed during a hurdle race at Belmont Park.
Pewtress Street	Margaret Pewtress OAM (Died 1995)	Netball Australian Sports Commissioner and board member 1984-95. All Australian umpire at age 21. Physical Education Teacher.
Titus Place	Jack Titus (1908-1978)	Footballer Played 294 games in the VFL for Richmond kicking 970 goals between 1926-47 career. Played in the 1943 premiership-winning side, represented Victoria 14 times between 1929-36. A VFL life member, in 1977 was the first recipient of the league's Recognition of Service Award. After retirement in 1947 served as a Richmond committeeman, selector, coach and VFL delegate.
