#### **Division of Gordon: Sportsmen and Sportswomen**

<b>NAME</b>	<b>ORIGIN</b>	<b>SIGNIFICANCE</b>
Batt Place	Batt Brothers, William Percy (1879-1947) and Harry Cyril Leslie (1885-1947)	Yachtsmen and boat builders.
Rollins Place	Edward Rollins (1852-1928)	Boxer, arrived in Australia from British Guiana in 1881; became a professional boxer, under the name of 'Starlight', in 1886; fought in Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne; spent four years (1896-1900) in England, where he won the European Middleweight Championship; returned to Australia, where he taught boxing.
McGilvray Close	Alan David McGilvray (1909-1996)	Cricket broadcaster; played cricket at first-class level; captained NSW 13 times between 1935 and 1938 before retiring to take up a full-time broadcasting position with the ABC; honoured with an MBE for his services to sport in 1974 and AM in 1980; his book 'The Game Is Not The Same' was published in 1987.

#### **Division of Gordon: Sportsmen and Sportswomen**

<b>NAME</b>	<b>ORIGIN</b>	<b>SIGNIFICANCE</b>
Oxenham Circuit	Ronald Oxenham (1891-1939)	Cricketer; in his late thirties and early forties, he appeared in Tests against England, the West Indies and South Africa; played in 46 Sheffield Shield matches; in his First-class career (1911-36) he scored 3,693 runs and took 369 wickets; in his seven Test matches he scored 151 runs and took 14 wickets.
Scully Street	Thomas Scully (1854-1924)	Race horse trainer; born in Canada, he arrived in Australia as an infant; first became involved with racing at Coolah, NSW; won 12 Picnic Cup races with 'Loch Leven'; moved to Sydney in 1902 and won the Metropolitan and Caulfield Cups with 'Marvel Loch', the Market Handicap, Melbourne Stakes, Craven Plate and Villiers Stakes with 'Cetigne', and the Breeders' Plate with 'Scully'.

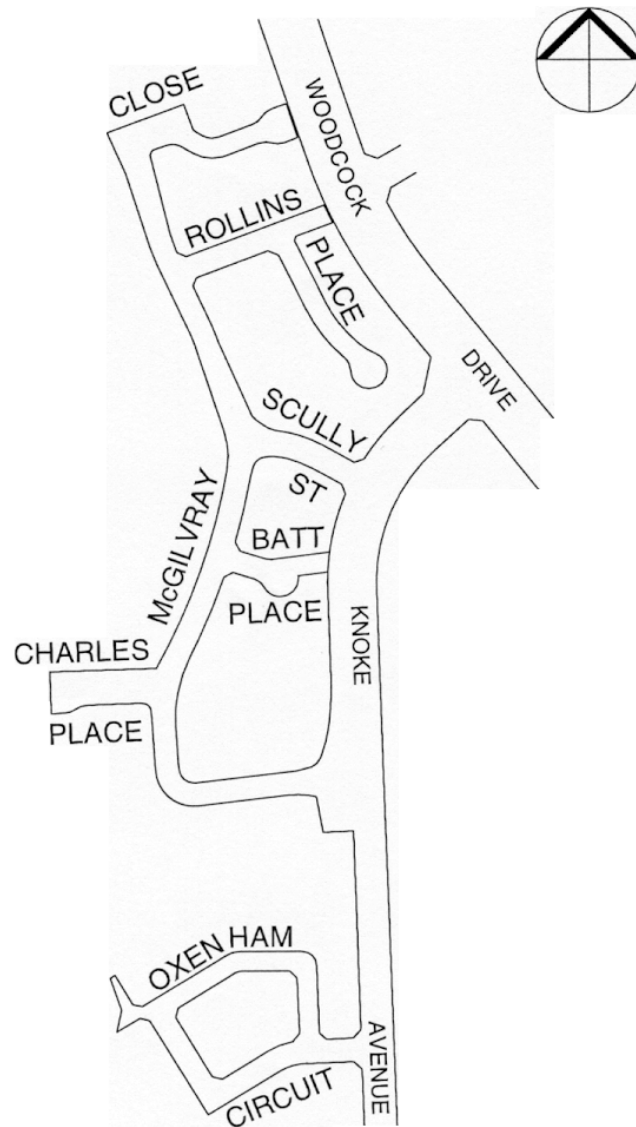
Charles Place
