NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Norman Fisher Circuit	Norman Fisher (1936-1997)	Norman Fisher held many positions in the Commonwealth Public Service, including Foundation Director, Bureau of Labour Market Research (1980), Director, Department of Employment and Industrial Relations (1982), Deputy Commissioner, Public Service Board (1986), Director, ACT Institute of Technical and Further Education 1988-1993, and again from 1993 until his retirement in 1997; founding Director of Australian International Hotel School.
Goldman Street	Emeritus Professor Ronald Goldman (1922-1996)	Born in Manchester, England; set up Australia's first centre for the study of educational communication and the media, the first centre of urban education, and other centres for teaching, counselling, innovation, curriculum studies and comparative and international studies; emerged as a key figure in the Australian international university scene in early 1970; encouraged his staff to innovate, and forged links with China and Vietnam as a basis for his school's future expansion.


STREET NOMENCLATURE

Medlin Street

Diana D'Este Medlin (1927-1997) Champion of coeducation in Australia; appointed headmistress of the Adelaide girls' college Girton in 1971, and principal of Pembroke College, which had been created by the merger in 1974 of Girton with the private boys' school, King's College; president of the Independent Schools Board of South Australia; chaired the ministerial advisory committee on the needs of nongovernment schools; became the first woman to serve on the council of the top university college, St Mark's; chair of the Child Protection Council in 1991.
