# **DECLARATION UNDER SUBSECTION 18(4)**

#### Citation

This Declaration may be cited as the Utilities (Declaration of Non-Franchise Natural Gas Customers) Declaration 2000.

### **Interpretation and Definitions**

- 2 In this Declaration:
  - (a) references to clauses or sub-clauses are references to clauses or sub-clauses in this Declaration;
  - (b) the following expression has the following meaning:
    - (i) "local gas supplier", in relation to the supply of natural gas to premises, means a utility licensed for the supply of natural gas to the premises.

#### **Declaration of Non-Franchise Customers**

- Any person who owns or occupies premises at which natural gas is consumed is declared to be a non-franchise customer in respect of the consumption of natural gas at these premises.
- This Declaration takes effect on the day nominated by that person in any notice given to the local gas supplier in accordance with clause 5.

#### **Notices to gas supplier**

- 5 The notices referred to in clause 4 shall:
  - (a) be in writing, signed by the person giving the notice (or under seal or by a duly authorised officer of that person, where the person is a corporation);
  - (b) be delivered to the local gas supplier by hand, courier, ordinary post, facsimile or electronic mail:
  - (c) state that the person giving the notice will become a non-franchise customer in respect of the premises itemised in the notice, on the day nominated in the notice.

- 6 Each notice referred to in this Declaration will be taken to have been given
  - (a) on the third business day after posting, if sent by ordinary post;
  - (b) on the day of delivery, if delivered by hand or by courier; or on the day of transmission, if sent by facsimile or electronic mail.
