15.1 Metering Data Services for Franchise Customer Loads

Metering data services for Franchise Customer Loads must comply with the requirements of the ACT Metrology Procedure for Type 5, 6 and 7 Metering Installations for the collection or calculation of energy data.

15.2 Franchise Customer Loads

For clause 15.1, **Franchise Customer Loads** are:

- (1) all interval metered **Loads**;
- (2) all unmetered **Loads**.

15.3 Metering Data Services for First Tier Loads

Metering data services for First Tier Loads must comply with the requirements of the ACT Metrology Procedure for Type 5, 6 and 7 Metering Installations for the collection or calculation and processing of energy data.

15.4 First Tier Loads

For clause 15.3, **First Tier Loads** are:

- (1) all interval metered **Loads**;
- (2) all unmetered **Loads**.

16 THRESHOLD FOR FRANCHISE CUSTOMER LOADS AND FIRST TIER LOADS FOR TYPE 5, TYPE 6 AND 7 METERING INSTALLATIONS

16.1 Threshold for Metering Installations

- (1) No upper Load limit applies to the use of Type 5, Type 6 or Type 7

 Metering Installations for Franchise Customer Loads and First Tier

 Loads
- (2) Unmetered Loads must be approved according to the National Electricity Code and the ACT Metrology Procedure for Type 5, 6 and 7 Metering Installations."

15 Dictionary – New definitions

After the definition of "Act" insert:

"ACT Metrology Procedure for Type 5, 6 and 7 Metering Installations" means the ACT Metrology Procedure for Type 5, 6 and 7 Metering Installations published under the National Electricity Code;'

After the definition of "Business Day" insert:

"Connection Point" means the agreed point of Supply established between an Electricity Distributor and a Customer;

After the definition of "Existing Metering Equipment" insert:

"First Tier Customer" means a Person who engages in the activity of purchasing electricity supplied through a distribution system and registers with the National Electricity Market Management Company ACN 072 010 327 as a customer in accordance with the National Electricity Code and who has classified their electricity purchase at any Connection Point as a First Tier Load;

"First Tier Load" means the electricity purchased at a Connection Point directly and in its entirety from the Local Electricity Supplier, whether or not it is classified as first tier in the National Electricity Code.'

After the definition of "Law" insert:

"Load" means a Connection Point or defined set of Connection Points at which electrical power is delivered to a person or to another network or the amount of electrical power delivered at a defined instant at a Connection Point, or aggregated over a defined set of Connection Points;

"Local Area" means the geographical area allocated to an Electricity Distributor by the laws of the ACT;

"Local Electricity Supplier" means the Electricity Supplier who is:

- (1) a business unit or related body corporate of the **Electricity Distributor**; or
- (2) responsible under the laws of the **Territory** for the **Supply** of electricity to **First Tier Customers**:

After the definition of "Metering Information" insert:

"Metering Installation" means the assembly of components and/or processes that are controlled for the purpose of metrology. The assembly of components may include the combination of several Metering Points to derive the Metering Information for a Connection Point;

"Metering Point" means the point of physical Connection of the device measuring the current in the power conductor;'

After the definition of "Standard Metering Equipment" insert:

"Supply" means the delivery of electricity;

After the definition of "Territory" insert:

"Type 5 Metering Installation" has the same meaning as in the National Electricity Code;

"Type 6 Metering Installation" has the same meaning as in the National Electricity Code;

"Type 7 Metering Installation" has the same meaning as in the National Electricity Code;

16 Dictionary – Revised definitions

Omit the definition of "Australian Standard" and after the definition of "Act" substitute:

"Australian Standard" or "AS/NZS" or "AS" means a standard published by Standards Australia;'

Omit the definition of "Franchise Customer" and substitute:

"Franchise Customer" means a Person who is a Franchise Customer of an Electricity Supplier for the purposes of the Act including any declaration of Franchise Customers made under section 18 of the Act;

Omit the definition of "Franchise Customer Electricity Metering Code" and after the definition of "Electricity Distributor" substitute:

"Electricity Metering Code" means the Electricity Metering Code approved by the Minister as a Technical Code under the Act;

Omit the definition of "Non-Franchise Customer" and substitute:

"Non-Franchise Customer" means a Person who is a Non-Franchise Customer of an Electricity Supplier for the purposes of the Act including any declaration of Non-Franchise Customers made under section 18 of the Act;

Omit the definition of "Standard Metering Equipment" and substitute:

"Standard Metering Equipment" means Metering Equipment that is generally supplied by an Electricity Distributor to its Franchise Customers and First Tier Customers to measure and record electricity consumed on the premises of those Customers;'
