

Highgate Lane	Highgate Café	Local Kingston History
		The Highgate Café was established by Haralambos (Harry) Notaras in 1927, three weeks before the opening of Parliament House on 9 May 1927.
		On that day, being the only eating house apart from the dining room of Parliament House, the Highgate Café served more than 4,000 meals, mainly steak and eggs, ham salad and pies.
		The Highgate Cafe was the meeting place for politicians and theatre patrons. In those days when Canberra's population was 5,000 Harry Notaras knew virtually everyone.
		The Notaras family maintained the tenancy of the Highgate until 1979, eight years after Haralambos' death in 1971.
