

District of Gungahlin: Gungahlin pioneers and homesteads.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Mulligans Flat Road	Mulligans Flat Reserve, ACT.	Mulligans Flat Reserve was included in Canberra Nature Park in 1994 after a submission from community environment groups to the ACT Government pointing out the significant attributes of the area.
		The area is said to be named after a man called 'Mulligan' who had a hut there in the early pioneering days.
		A provisional school was established at Mulligans Flat in 1896 and was used until 1931, after which it was demolished.
		The shearing shed and yards date from the 1940's and were used until 1994.
		The path of the old 19th century coach road from Murrumbateman to Bungendore can still be seen where the original trees form an avenue within the reserve.
		This new road passes by Mulligans Flat.
Old Gundaroo Road	Gundaroo Road	This road is the remnant of the road that connected 'Ginninderra' with 'Gundaroo'. From the ACT it was known as Gundaroo Road and from NSW it was known as Ginninderra Road.
