

		Canberra artist Rosalie Gascoigne was born in New Zealand and came to Canberra in 1943 when she married Ben Gascoigne an astronomer at Mount Stromlo Observatory.
		Her work covered many mediums and features landscapes in and around Canberra. Rosalie and her husband would roam the roads and byways collecting old and discarded road signs, wooden boxes and metal parts for her art.
		Rosalie exhibited her work in the United States and Europe, and in 1982 became the first woman to represent Australia at the Venice Biennale.
		Apart from her vast body of valuable work Rosalie will be remembered for her contribution to young Canberra artists and her ongoing role in the local arts community.
