PHARMACY ACT 1931**

DETERMINATION NO ...116... OF 1993

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The *Pharmacy Act 1931* (The Act) provides for the registration of Pharmacists and to Control the Practice of Pharmacy.

This instrument revokes all existing determinations of fees payable under subsections 24(d) and 26(1)(b) of the Act and sets new fees which are indexed according to Consumer Price Index (CPI) increases.

1. Subsection 24(d) provides for a determined fee to be paid where a person has lodged an application with the ACT Pharmacy Board in accordance with subsection 23 of the Act for registration as a pharmacist.

The granting of registration by the Board where a person applies in accordance with section 23 is subject to the payment of that fee.

The current fee under subsection 24(d) is \$52.00 and the recommended increase for this fee is \$54.00.

2. Subsection 26(1)(b) provides for a requirement for a registered pharmacist to pay the determined fee on or before 31 October in each year.

Failure of a registered pharmacist to pay the annual fee will result in the Board cancelling the registration of that person under the provisions of subsection 26(4).

The current fee under subsection 26(1)(b) is \$52.00 and the recommended increase for this fee is \$54.00.
