### COURT SECURITY BILL 2000

#### Notes on proposed Government Amendments

#### Amendment 1 Clause 5, Paragraph (1)(b)

This amendment makes it clearer that a person must comply with the requirements imposed under the proposed Act by a security officer. It reflects a suggestion made by the Scrutiny of Bills Committee.

#### Amendment 2 Clause 5, Paragraph (2)(j)

This amendments removes a reference to an Act that is to be repealed. It was suggested by Parliamentary Counsel.

#### Amendment 3

This amendment ensures that a person attending court has the option of leaving if that person does not wish to state his or her name, address or reason for attending court or provide evidence of identity. It reflects a suggestion made by the Scrutiny of Bills Committee.

#### Amendment 4

This amendment ensures that a person's appointment as a security officer may be terminated if he or she is no longer competent to act as such. It reflects a suggestion made by the Scrutiny of Bills Committee.
