MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS REGISTRATION ACT 1930

DETERMINATION NO. 64 of 1992

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Medical Practitioners Registration Act 1930 provides for the registration of legally qualified practitioners, and for fees to be charged in respect to the granting of both initial and annual registration. Section 42 of the Act empowers the Minister, by notice published in the Gazette, to determine fees in respect to paragraphs 22(3)(f), 22A(4)(c) and 24A(1)(b) of the Act.

This instrument:

1. Revokes all existing fees and determinations under the Medical Practitioners Registration Act 1930 which relate to paragraphs 22(3)(f), 22A(4)(c) and 24A(1)(b) which provisions make the collection of fees for both initial and annual registrations; and
2. Sets fees for the purposes of the Act as they relate to:

paragraph 24A(1)(b)	\$20.00	\$75.00

[These fees have not been reviewed since 1983 and do not, even after these increases, reflect the level of fees charged by other State medical boards, where the average fee is \$90-\$100.00.]
