Boxing Control Regulations (Amendment) 1995

Outline

The Boxing Control Act 1993 ("the Act") provides a legislative regime to regulate the conduct of amateur and professional boxing in the Australian Capital Territory. The Act provides that regulations may be made to exempt certain boxing contests from the application of the Act. The Boxing Control Regulations ("the Regulations") lists certain boxing contests that have been exempted.

The Boxing Control Regulations (Amendment) will amend the Regulations by specifying two contests that will be exempt from the application of the Act.

Revenue/Cost Implications

The regulation has no revenue or cost implications.

Detail of Amending Regulation

Clause 1 refers to the commencement date of the regulation. The regulation will commence on 19 August 1995.

Clause 2 amends the Regulations by inserting two new paragraphs (h) and (i) in Regulation 3, which will exempt two amateur boxing contests from the provisions of the Act. New paragraph (h) refers to an amateur fist-boxing tournament promoted by the Canberra Police and Citizen's Youth Club, to be held at the Turner Police and Citizen's Youth Club on 19 August 1995. New paragraph (i) refers to an amateur kick-boxing tournament promoted by Ms Sandra Orr, to be held at the Jamison Inn on 20 August 1995.
