Schedule

For inspectors in relation to all licensed utilities:

Certification by a JAZ-ANZ approved Certification Body to undertake quality assurance audits to AS/NZS ISO 9001:2000 and eligibility for registration as an International Auditor And Training Certification Association (IATCA) Senior Auditor with the Quality Society of Australasia or other auditor certification body which is a Multilateral Recognition Agreement (MLA) member of IATCA and for the industry (or JAZ-ANZ) code - Building and Construction.

or

Professional qualifications admitting to Corporate Membership of the Institution of Engineers Australia combined with at least 10 years experience, including at least 5 years at middle to senior management level, in a water supply and sewerage utility, an electrical distribution utility or a gas distribution utility.

For inspectors in relation to electrical distribution utilities:

A electrician eligible to be licensed under the Electricity Safety Act 1971 or an electric lineworker eligible for Certificate IV in Electrical Supply Industry (ESI) Distribution, ESI Distribution and Transmission, ESI Frontline Management or Electrical Inspection under the Australian Qualifications Framework combined with at least 10 years experience, including a minimum of 5 years at supervisory level, in electrical distribution or electrical safety work with an electrical distribution utility or an electrical safety regulatory agency.

For inspectors in relation to gas distribution or gas transmission utilities:

A gasfitter eligible to be licensed under the Plumbers, Drainers and Gasfitters Board Act 1982 as a gasfitter and eligible for Certificate IV in Plumbing under the Australian Qualifications Framework combined with at least 10 years experience, including a minimum of 5 years at supervisory level, in gas distribution or gas safety with a gas distribution utility or a gas safety regulatory agency.
