

Exhibition Park Corporation (Governing Board) Appointment 2009 (No 3)

Exhibition Park Corporation Act 1976, s 8 (Establishment of governing board), s 9 (Governing board members), *Financial Management Act 1996*, s 78 (Appointment of governing board members generally), s 79 (Appointment of Chair and deputy chair)

1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Exhibition Park Corporation (Governing Board) Appointment 2009 (No 3)*.

2 Commencement

This instrument is taken to have commenced on 1 July 2009.

3 Revocation of previous instrument

The *Exhibition Park Corporation (Governing Board) Appointment 2009* (Notifiable Instrument NI 2009—310) is revoked.

4 Appointment of chair and deputy chair

- (1) I appoint the public servant occupying from time to time the position of Chief Executive, Department of Territory and Municipal Services as the chair of the governing board of the Exhibition Park Corporation.
- (2) I appoint the public servant occupying from time to time the position of Executive Director, Territory and Municipal Services with responsibility for administrative oversight of the *Exhibition Park Corporation Act 1976* as the deputy chair of the governing board of the Corporation.

5 Appointment of member

I appoint the public servant occupying from time to time the position of General Manager, Territory Venue and Events, Department of Territory and Municipal Services as a member of the governing board of the Exhibition Park Corporation.

6 Term of appointments

The appointments in section 4 and section 5 of this instrument end on 30 June 2012.

- Note 1* As this instrument appoints public servants to the governing board of the corporation, the appointments do not require referral to the Legislative Assembly, nor is the instrument disallowable – see *Legislation Act 2001*, division 19.3.3.
- Note 2* The Minister may make an appointment by naming the person appointed or by nominating the occupant of a position (however described), at a particular time or from time to time—see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 207.
- Note 3* ‘Occupy’, in relation to a position, is defined to include hold the position, act in the position or exercise functions of the position—see *Legislation Act 2001*, dictionary Part 1.
