1 Name of appointment

2 The Complaint

The Attorney General for the Australian Capital Territory (the Attorney General) received a complaint (the Complaint) in relation to the Chief Magistrate of the Australian Capital Territory (the Chief Magistrate) on 23 October 2009.

The terms of the Complaint received by the Attorney General are that:

On or about 21 October 2009, Chief Magistrate R J Cahill caused or procured the creation and transmission of written material to Special Magistrate Peter Lauritsen which had, or might have had, the effect of interfering with the conduct of criminal proceedings to be heard by his Honour relating to a public figure known professionally and socially to the Chief Magistrate before the proceedings commenced.

3 Judicial Commission

as members of a Judicial Commission to examine the Complaint and to submit a report of its examination by 11 December 2009.

1 Timing
