No. 2 of 1928.

AN ORDINANCE

Relating to Standard Time in the Territory for the Seat of Government.

R E it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909, and the Seat of Government Administration Act 1910, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Standard Time Short title. Ordinance 1928.
- 2.—(1.) The mean time of the one hundred and fiftieth The time of 150th meridian meridian of longitude of Greenwich in England shall be deemed to be standard and is hereby declared to be standard time throughout the Territory.

(2.) Whenever any expression of time occurs in any Ordinance or in any rule, regulation, or by-law under any Ordinance, or in any deed or instrument whatsoever, and whenever the doing or not doing anything at a certain time of day or night, or during a certain part of the day or the night, has an effect in law, such time shall, unless it is otherwise specifically stated, be held to be standard time throughout the Territory as declared by this Ordinance.
