

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 10 of 1929.

AN ORDINANCE

For the Protection of the Arms of Federal Capital Commissioners Australia and the City of Canberra.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Federal Capital Commission's Arms Ordinance 1929*. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
“Arms of the Commission” means the arms of the Federal Capital Commissioners Australia and the City of Canberra.

3.—(1.) A person shall not, without the authority of the Federal Capital Commission (proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused), assume or use in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession, the Arms of the Commission or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the Arms of the Commission as to be likely to deceive. Penalty on unauthorized use of Commission's Arms.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.

(2.) Without limiting the meaning of the preceding subsection, the Arms of the Commission or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the Arms of the Commission as to be likely to deceive shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession if they are applied (whether as a trade mark or otherwise) to any goods manufactured, produced, sold or offered for sale by that person.
