THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 23 of 1932.

AN ORDINANCE

To provide for the appointment of a Sheriff.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1931, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sheriff Ordinance 1932. Short title.
- 2. There shall be a Sheriff of the Territory, who shall be appointed Appointment by the Attorney-General and shall hold office during his pleasure.
- 3. The Sheriff of the Territory shall have, and may exercise or power execute, in the Territory all the powers, functions and duties of the sheriff. Sheriff or of a District Sheriff under the law in force in the Territory immediately prior to the acceptance of the Territory by the Commonwealth, together with such other powers, functions and duties as are from time to time conferred on the Sheriff by any law of the Territory.
