THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 8 of 1934.

AN ORDINANCE

**To provide for the Appointment of Officers to assist
the Sheriff, and for other purposes.**

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1933, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Sheriff Ordinance* 1934. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance—

“the Sheriff” means the Sheriff of the Territory appointed under the *Seat of Government Supreme Court Act* 1933; and

Definitions.

“the Supreme Court” means the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory.

3.—(1.) The Attorney-General may appoint such persons as he thinks fit to assist the Sheriff in the execution of his duties, and all acts done by those persons shall be deemed to be done by and under the authority of the Sheriff and shall be as valid and effectual as if done by the Sheriff. Appointment of officers to assist the Sheriff.

(2.) If any person so appointed is not an officer of the Commonwealth or of the Territory, he shall receive such remuneration as the Attorney-General directs or as is prescribed.

4. All powers and functions exercisable by, and all rights, privileges, immunities and liabilities belonging to, the Sheriff shall be exercisable by and belong to the persons appointed in pursuance of the last preceding section. Powers, &c., of persons appointed to assist the Sheriff.

5. The Attorney-General may make regulations prescribing the fees to be chargeable in the Sheriff's office in respect of all matters pending at any time in the Supreme Court, and, until any such regulations are made, the fees to be so chargeable shall, so far as applicable, be those fixed under the *Sheriff Act* 1900 of the State of New South Wales. Fees.
