No. 9 of 1935.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the *Business Names Ordinance 1933*.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Business Names Ordinance 1935*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Business Names Ordinance 1933* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Business Names Ordinance 1933-1935*.

2. Section twenty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after sub-section (2.) the following sub-section:— Prohibited names.

“(3.) A person or firm required to be registered under this Ordinance shall not be so registered under a firm-name which—

- (a) is the same as the firm-name of any other person or firm so registered, or is so similar to any such firm-name as to be likely to be mistaken for it;
- (b) is the same as the name under which any company or society is registered under any Ordinance or law, or is so similar to any such name as to be likely to be mistaken for it; or
- (c) includes the word ‘proprietary’, ‘bank’, ‘limited’ or ‘unlimited’.”.
