AN ORDINANCE

Relating to the Renewal of Licences granted under the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor (Renewal of short title. Licences) Ordinance 1951.*
- 2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Liquor validation of Ordinance 1929-1950, where—

certain payments and authority

- (a) the Magistrate, during the month of December, One to issue licences. thousand nine hundred and fifty, granted a renewal of a licence; and
- (b) the licence-fee fixed by the Magistrate for the renewal of the licence was not paid on or before the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, but has been paid to the Registrar on or before the date on which this Ordinance comes into operation.
- the licence-fee so fixed shall be deemed to have been paid to, and accepted by, the Registrar on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and the Registrar shall issue a licence under the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950 in accordance with such form in the Schedule to that Ordinance as is appropriate to the case.
 - (2.) A licence issued in pursuance of the last preceding subsection shall be as valid and effectual as if the licence-fee had been paid and accepted on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and shall be deemed to have taken effect on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

Interpretation.

3. Words and expressions used in this Ordinance shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the same meanings as in the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950.
