AN ORDINANCE

Relating to the Renewal of Licences granted under the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Renewal of Licences) Ordinance 1951*.*

2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950*, where—

(a) the Magistrate, during the month of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, granted a renewal of a licence; and

(b) the licence-fee fixed by the Magistrate for the renewal of the licence was not paid on or before the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, but has been paid to the Registrar on or before the date on which this Ordinance comes into operation,

the licence-fee so fixed shall be deemed to have been paid to, and accepted by, the Registrar on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and the Registrar shall issue a licence under the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950* in accordance with such form in the Schedule to that Ordinance as is appropriate to the case.

(2.) A licence issued in pursuance of the last preceding subsection shall be as valid and effectual as if the licence-fee had been paid and accepted on the twenty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and shall be deemed to have taken effect on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

Interpretation.

3. Words and expressions used in this Ordinance shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the same meanings as in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950*.
