## AN ORDINANCE

## To amend the National Memorials Ordinance 1928-1952.

B E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia with the advise of the Federal Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947, as follows:-

1.-(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the National Memorials Short title and citation. Ordinance 1953.\*

(2.) The National Memorials Ordinance 1928-1952, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the National Memorials Ordinance 1928-1953.

2. Section three of the National Memorials Ordinance 1928-Establishment 1952 is amended by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words "recognized as authorities on Australian history" and inserting in their stead the words "residents of the Australian Capital Territory ".
