To amend the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1949*.

NURSES REGISTRATION ORDINANCE 1956.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1956*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1949*[†] is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Nurses Registration Ordinance 1933-1956*.

2. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the word “five” and inserting in its stead the word “seven”; and
 - (b) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the words “the Governor-General” and inserting in their stead the words “the Minister”.
- Members of The Board.

3. Section twenty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting at the end thereof the following sub-section:—

“(7.) The Board shall not register a person as a nurse unless the person proves to the satisfaction of the Board that the person is of sound health or of such a state of health that, if the person were registered as a nurse, the health of any one attended by the person would not be endangered.”.
