

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

Regulations under the Companies Ordinance 1931.

I, ALEXANDER JOHN McLACHLAN, Vice-President of the Executive Council, acting for and on behalf of the Attorney-General for the Commonwealth, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Companies Ordinance 1931*, hereby make the following Regulations, to come into operation forthwith.

AMENDMENT OF THE COMPANIES REGULATIONS.

After Regulation 2 of the Companies Regulations, the following regulations are inserted:—

Fees to be paid in advance.

“3. The prescribed fees shall be paid in advance upon application being made for registration or upon lodgment of any documents, as the case may be.

Demand for fees, how made.

“4. Any demand for fees payable under the Companies Acts or these Regulations shall be deemed to be duly made if a letter requesting their payment be sent in the ordinary course of post, addressed to the company concerned, or to the manager, secretary or other officer of such company at the place where business is being or was last carried on by the company.

Form of statutory declaration.

“5. The statutory declaration required to be filed by section seven of the *Companies (Amendment) Act 1906*, of the State of New South Wales, in its application to the Territory, shall be in accordance with Form A in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Attestation on memorandum and Articles of Association.

“6. The attestation to be endorsed upon the copy of the Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association by section seven of the *Companies (Amendment) Act 1906*, of the State of New South Wales, in its application to the Territory, prior to lodgment shall be in accordance with Form B in the Schedule to these Regulations and shall be signed in the presence of a witness.

Certificate of Registration.

“7. The certificate of registration issued under section eleven of the *Companies (Amendment) Act 1906* shall be in accordance with Form C in the Schedule to these Regulations.”

STATUTORY DECLARATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF REGISTERING A FOREIGN COMPANY.

NOTE.—(i) A Statutory Declaration may be made before—

(a) a Police Stipendiary or Special Magistrate, or a Justice of the Peace; or

(b) a Commissioner for Affidavits; or

(c) a Commissioner for Declarations; or

(d) a Notary Public.

(ii) Any person who wilfully makes a false statement in a Statutory Declaration is guilty of an indictable offence, and is liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for four years.
