JURIES FEES REGULATIONS.

Short title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Juries Fees Regulations.

Fees.

2. The fees to be paid to any person who serves as a juror in any criminal cause or in any civil case shall be as follows:—

For each day of attendance of more than four hours up to three days	9	0
For each day of attendance not exceeding four hours from time of attending	5	0
For the fourth and every subsequent day's attendance of more than four hours on the same panel	12	0
Jurors if continuously on the same trial, in any civil case, for more than three days, shall be entitled to such further sum (if any) as the presiding Justice shall direct.		
Bystanders sworn on any trial, for each day of attendance exceeding four hours	9	0
Bystanders sworn on any trial, for each day of attendance not exceeding four hours from time of attending	5	0
Travelling expenses for every mile of distance in excess of three miles, between the juror's residence and the Court (one way, and for one day only)		1 0
