## Regulations under the Hospital Tax Ordinance 1933.

I, CHARLES WILLIAM CLANAN MARR, Minister of State for Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Hospital Tax Ordinances 1933 hereby make the following Regulations to come into operation forthwith.

#### AMENDMENT OF HOSPITAL TAX REGULATIONS.

The Hospital Tax Regulations, as amended by Regulation dated 24th March, 1933, are hereby amended by—

(a) omitting paragraphs A. and B. of regulation 6 and inserting in their stead the following:—

A .- General in-patient charges-

Patients occupying beds in private wards—Four guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications.

Patients occupying beds in community wards-Three guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications.

Patients occupying screened beds in public wards—Three guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications.

Patients occupying beds in public wards—Two guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications.

### B.—Obstetric cases—

Patients occupying beds in private rooms—Four guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications and laundry services. 

Patients occupying beds in community wards—Three guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications and laundry services.

Patients occupying screened beds in community wards-Three and a half guineas per week; and, in addition, the cost of all medications and laundry services.

(b) omitting paragraphs E (v) and (vi) of regulation 6 and inserting in their stead the following:—

(v) Radiographic Examinations—

- (a) Ordinary radiographic examinations—One guinea; and
  - (b) Radiographic examinations of alimentary tract by opaque meals—Two guineas.
