Regulation under the Juries Ordinance 1932-1938.

I HERBERT VERE EVATT, the Attorney-General of the Commonwealth, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Juries Ordinance 1932-1938*, hereby make the following Regulation.

AMENDMENT OF THE JURIES FEES REGULATIONS.

Regulation 2 of the Juries Fees Regulations is repealed and the following regulation inserted in its stead:—

“2. The fees to be paid to any person who serves as a juror in any criminal cause or in any civil case shall be as follows:—

	Per day.	Per mile.

For each day of attendance of more than four hours up to three days	17 0	
For each day of attendance not exceeding four hours from time of attending	10 0	
For the fourth and every subsequent day's attendance of more than four hours on the same panel	20 0	
Jurors, if continuously on the same trial, in any civil case, for more than three days, shall be entitled to such further sum (if any) as the presiding Justice shall direct.		
Bystanders sworn on any trial, for each day of attendance exceeding four hours	17 0	
Bystanders sworn on any trial, for each day of attendance not exceeding four hours from time of attending	10 0	
Travelling expenses for every mile of distance in excess of three miles, between the juror's residence and the Court (one way, and for one day only)		1 0".
