Regulations under the Canberra Community Hospital Ordinance 1938-1952.*

I EARLE PAGE, Minister of State for Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Canberra Community Hospital Ordinance 1938-1952*, hereby make the following Regulations.

CANBERRA COMMUNITY HOSPITAL (CHARGES) REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Canberra Community Hospital (Charges) Regulations.
2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of Commencement July, 1952.
- 3.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention Interpretation. appears—
 - “in-patient” means a person who occupies a bed in the Hospital for the purposes of treatment;
 - “out-patient” means a person who receives treatment at the Hospital other than as an in-patient;
 - “the Ordinance” means the *Canberra Community Hospital Ordinance 1938-1952*.
- (2.) For the purposes of these Regulations—
 - (a) the day of admission to the Hospital and the day of discharge or death shall be counted as one day; and
 - (b) a child under the age of twelve months and the mother of that child if they are in-patients at the same time, shall be deemed to be one in-patient.

4. For the purposes of these Regulations, the Minister or a person authorized in writing by the Minister for the purposes of this regulation may classify the wards of the Hospital as general wards, intermediate wards or private wards, and may, from time to time, vary the classification of those wards. Charges for

5. The charge for treatment provided by the Board for an in-patient is at the rate of—

- (a) Eighteen shillings per day in respect of an in-patient in a general ward;
- (b) One pound four shillings per day in respect of an in-patient in an intermediate ward; and
- (c) One pound ten shillings per day in respect of an in-patient in a private ward.

Charges for

out-patients.

6.—(1.) Subject to this regulation, the charge for a radiological service (including a report on that service) provided for an out-patient, being a service specified in column 2 of the First Schedule to these Regulations, is the amount specified in column 3 of that Schedule opposite to that service.

(2.) Where, at a radiological examination forming part of a service specified in the First Schedule to these Regulations, it is necessary to take three films, the charge for that service is, unless otherwise provided in that Schedule, an amount which is one and one-half times the amount specified in that Schedule opposite to that service or, if a charge is specified in relation to that service for one or two films, an amount which is one and one-half times the amount specified in that Schedule opposite to that service for two films.

(3.) Where, at a radiological examination forming part of a service specified in the First Schedule to these Regulations it is necessary to take four or more films, the charge for that service is, unless otherwise provided in that Schedule, the sum of—

- (a) the amount ascertained in accordance with the last preceding sub-regulation for the first three films; and
- (b) for each film after the first three films—an amount which is one-quarter of the amount specified in that Schedule opposite to that service or, if a charge is specified in relation to that service for one or two films, an amount which is one quarter of the amount specified in that Schedule opposite to that service for two films.

7. The charge for a dental service provided for an out-patient, being a service specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule to these Regulations, is the amount specified in column 3 of that Schedule opposite to that service.

Charges for
other services

8.—(1.) The charge for a course of treatment by physiotherapy provided for an out-patient is Five shillings for the first visit and Two shillings and sixpence for each subsequent visit during each period for which the out-patient receives that course of treatment.

(2.) The charge for casualty service provided for an out-patient is Five shillings.

(3.) The charge for an electrocardiograph examination of an out-patient is Two pounds two shillings.
