AMENDMENTS OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE (THIRD PARTY INSURANCE) REGULATIONS.

The First Schedule to the Motor Vehicle (Third Party Insurance) First Schedule. Regulations is amended—

(a) by omitting item number 9 and inserting in its stead the following item:—

"9 Motor Cycle.—Any motor vehicle, not included in Class 10 or 12, which has less than four wheels and is steered by means of a handle bar or a tiller—

(b) where the engine of the motor cycle is rated at more than one horse-power but not more than two and one-half horse-power.

(c) where the engine of the motor cycle is rated at one horse-power or less ...

(b) by omitting from the column headed "Premium" each of the amounts set out in that column (other than the amount set out opposite item number 9), being the amounts respectively set out in the first column of the Schedule to this regulation, and inserting in its stead the amount shown opposite to it in the second column of that last-mentioned Schedule.
