About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Long Service Leave (Building and Construction Industry) Regulation 1984*, made under the *Long Service Leave (Building and Construction Industry) Act 1981* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 2 November 2004. It also includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 2 November 2004.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Long Service Leave (Building and Construction Industry) Regulation 1988*.

2 Awards

For the Act, section 3 (1), definition of ***building and construction work*** each of the following awards, as varied and in force from time to time, is a prescribed award:

- (a) Australian Workers' Union Construction-on-Site and Civil Engineering (A.C.T.) Award 1981;
- (b) The Building and Construction Industry (ACT) Award 1991;
- (c) Electrical Contracting Industry Award 1992;
- (d) Draughtsmen, Planners and Technical Officers (A.C.T.) Award 1982;
- (e) National Metal and Engineering On-Site Construction Industry Award 1989;
- (f) Metal Trades (A.C.T.) Award 1982;
- (g) Plumbing Industry (A.C.T.) Award 1982;
- (h) The Sprinkler Pipe Fitters' Award 1975;
- (i) Transport Workers' (A.C.T.) Award 1982.

Endnotes

1 About the endnotes

Amending and modifying laws are annotated in the legislation history and the amendment history. Current modifications are not included in the republished law but are set out in the endnotes.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

3 Legislation history

This regulation was originally called the *Long Service Leave (Building and Construction Industry) Regulations* and was originally made under a Commonwealth ordinance—the *Long Service (Building and Construction Industry) Ordinance 1981* No 23 (Cwlth).

The *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth), s 34 (4) converted most former Commonwealth ordinances in force in the ACT, and the regulations made under them, into ACT enactments. This allowed the ACT Legislative Assembly to amend and repeal the laws. The *Long Service (Building and Construction Industry) Ordinance 1981* and the *Long Service Leave (Building and Construction Industry) Regulations* were converted into ACT enactments on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

As with most ordinances in force in the ACT, the name of the ordinance was changed from *Ordinance* to *Act* by the *Self-Government (Citation of Laws) Act 1989* No 21, s 5 on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

This regulation was renamed under the *Legislation Act 2001*.

Before 12 September 2001, a regulations commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Interpretation Act 1967* s 50, *Subordinate Laws Act 1989* s 6).
