About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Poisons and Drugs Regulations 1993*, made under the *Poisons and Drugs Act 1978* as in force on 21 December 2001. It includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 12 September 2001 and any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes).

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol \boxed{U} appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol M appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

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1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the Poisons and Drugs Regulations 1993.

3 Prescribed institutions

For the Act, section 3 (2), definition of *recognised institution*, paragraph (b), the following institutions are prescribed:

- (a) The Australian National University;
- (b) Canberra Institute of Technology;
- (c) the University College within the Australian Defence Force Academy;
- (d) Australian Catholic University;
- (e) University of Canberra.

4 Prescribed restricted substances

For the Act, section 5, the restricted substances specified in schedule 3, column 2 are prescribed.

5 Prescribed class—restricted substances

For the Act, section 8, the class of persons specified in schedule 3, column 3 is prescribed in relation to the substance specified opposite it in column 1.

6 Prescribed class and purpose

- (1) For the Act, section 33 (2) (b), in relation to a poison specified in schedule 1, column 2—
 - (a) a class of persons specified opposite that poison in column 3 of that schedule is prescribed; and
 - (b) a purpose set out opposite each such class in column 4 of that schedule is a prescribed purpose in relation to that class for which a member of that class may possess the poison.

(2) For the Act, section 33 (2) (b), persons in day-to-day control of analytical laboratories are prescribed with respect to a poison specified in schedule 2 for the prescribed purpose of analysis.
