About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Magistrates Court (Security Industry Infringement Notices)* Regulation 2003, made under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 2 October 2015. It also includes any commencement, amendment, repeal or expiry affecting this republished law to 2 October 2015.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the Legislation Act 2001 applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced, the symbol $\boxed{\textbf{U}}$ appears immediately before the provision heading. Any uncommenced amendments that affect this republished law are accessible on the ACT legislation register (www.legislation.act.gov.au). Modifications

Penalties

1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Magistrates Court* (Security Industry Infringement Notices) Regulation 2003.

3 Purpose of regulation

The purpose of this regulation is to create a system of infringement notices under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 3.8 for certain offences against the Security Act.

Note The Magistrates Court Act 1930, pt 3.8 provides a system of infringement notices for offences against various Acts. The infringement notice system is intended to provide an alternative to prosecution.

4 Notes

A note included in this regulation is explanatory and is not part of this regulation.

Note See the Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

5 Meaning of Security Act

In this regulation:

Security Act means the Security Industry Act 2003.

6 Administering authority

The administering authority for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act is the commissioner for fair trading.

7 Infringement notice offences

The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 3.8 applies to an offence against a provision of the Security Act mentioned in schedule 1, column 2.

8 Infringement notice penalties

- (1) The penalty payable by an individual for an offence against the Security Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (2) The penalty payable by a corporation for an offence against the Security Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is 5 times the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (3) The cost of serving a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act is \$34.

9 Contents of infringement notices—other information

(1) An infringement notice served on a company by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must include the company's ACN.

Note The requirement under this section is additional to the requirement under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, s 121 (1) (c).

(2) In this section:

company means a company registered under the Corporations Act.

10 Contents of infringement notices—identifying authorised person

An infringement notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must identify the authorised person by—

(a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer's service number; or

- (b) for an authorised person who is authorised by the commissioner for fair trading under the *Fair Trading* (Australian Consumer Law) Act 1992, section 36—
 - (i) the person's full name, or surname and initials; or
 - (ii) any unique number given to the person by the administering authority for this regulation.

11 Contents of reminder notices—identifying authorised person

A reminder notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act must identify the authorised person by—

- (a) for an authorised person who is a police officer—the police officer's service number; or
- (b) for an authorised person who is authorised by the commissioner for fair trading under the *Fair Trading* (Australian Consumer Law) Act 1992, section 36—
 - (i) the person's full name, or surname and initials; or
 - (ii) any unique number given to the person by the administering authority for this regulation.

12 Authorised people for infringement notice offences

- (1) An authorised person may serve the following:
 - (a) an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act;
 - (b) a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Security Act.
