1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Community Based Sentences (Transfer) Regulation 2004*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 Dictionary

The dictionary at the end of this regulation is part of this regulation.

Note 1 The dictionary at the end of this regulation defines certain terms used in this regulation, and includes references (*signpost definitions*) to other terms defined elsewhere in this regulation.

For example, the signpost definition ‘*required details*—see the Act, section 22.’ means that the term ‘required details’ is defined in that section and the definition applies to this regulation.

Note 2 A definition in the dictionary (including a signpost definition) applies to the entire regulation unless the definition, or another provision of the regulation, provides otherwise or the contrary intention otherwise appears (see Legislation Act, s 155 and s 156 (1)).

4 Notes

A note included in this regulation is explanatory and is not part of this regulation.

Note See the Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

5 *Participating jurisdiction—Act, s 8 (3)*

New South Wales is a *participating jurisdiction*.

**6 *Registration of interstate sentences, required details—
Act, s 22***

Schedule 1 sets out the required details to be entered in the local register for the registration of an interstate sentence.

1	Offender details— <ul style="list-style-type: none">• names (given and surname)• aliases (if any)• date of birth
2	Sentence details— <ul style="list-style-type: none">• name or kind of interstate sentence• name or kind of corresponding sentence in ACT• length of sentence• start date• date when offender first reported for interstate sentence in participating jurisdiction• end date• remaining period of sentence to be served in the ACT• sentence history including appeals and registrations in other participating jurisdictions
