

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 21 of 1933.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Pharmacy Ordinance 1931.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1933*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1933*.

2. Section ten of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

“10. The Governor-General may, if he is satisfied that any member has been guilty of misbehaviour or incapacity, remove that member from office.” Removal from office as member.

3. Section twenty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the figures “1928” and inserting in their stead the figures and words “1915 or the *Medical Act 1928*”. Persons who may apply for registration.

4. Section thirty-one of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (1.) the word “Registrar” and inserting in its stead the word “Register”. Correction of register.

5. Section thirty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end of sub-section (4.) the words “whose decision shall be final and conclusive and without appeal”. Grounds for cancellation of registration.

6. Section forty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended—
(a) by inserting in paragraph (a), after the word “pharmacist”, the words “, as an assistant or agent of a registered pharmacist”; and Conduct of business of pharmacist.

(b) by adding at the end thereof the following paragraphs:—

“; (g) allow his name to be used in connexion with the practice of pharmacy at any premises at which there is not a registered pharmacist in daily attendance; or

(h) aid or assist any person other than a registered pharmacist to practise pharmacy except in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.”.

Inquiries into offences.

7. Section forty-nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words “and may be enforced in the same manner as the order of a Court of summary jurisdiction” and inserting in their stead the words “The amount specified in any such order shall be a debt due to the Crown and may be sued for and recovered by action instituted by any officer authorized in writing by the Director-General in any Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.”.

Regulations.

8. Section fifty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by inserting in paragraph (f), after the word “be”, the word “manufactured,”;

(b) by omitting from paragraph (g) the word “and” (last occurring); and

(c) by inserting after paragraph (g) the following paragraph:—

“(ga) the qualifications of apprentices and the conditions under which apprentices may be employed; and”.
