PHARMACY ORDINANCE 1971

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1971*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1970*[†] is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1971*.

2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after the definition of "registered veterinary surgeon" the following definition:— Definitions.

" 'the Assistant Director' means the person for the time being occupying, or performing the duties of, the office of Assistant Director, Department of Health, Australian Capital Territory; ".

3. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-sections (1.) and (3.) the word "Director" and inserting in its stead the words "Assistant Director". Members of the Board.
