PHARMACY ORDINANCE 1971

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the Pharmacy Ordinance Short title and 1971.*
- (2.) The Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1970† is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1971.
- 2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after Definitions. the definition of "registered veterinary surgeon" the following definition:-
 - "'the Assistant Director' means the person for the time being occupying, or performing the duties of, the office of Assistant Director, Department of Health, Australian Capital Territory; ".
- 3. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting Members of from sub-sections (1.) and (3.) the word "Director" and inserting in the Board. its stead the words "Assistant Director".
