An Act to set, and report about, greenhouse gas emissions targets and related targets to assist in achieving a sustainable future for the ACT

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1	Part 1	Preliminary
2	1	Name of Act
3 4		This Act is the Climate Change (Greenhouse Gas Emissions Targets) Act 2008 (No 2).
5	2	Commencement
6		This Act commences on the day after its notification day.
7 8		Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).
9	3	Objects of Act
0		The objects of this Act are—
1		(a) to set targets in relation to greenhouse gas emissions and electricity use to—
3 4 5		 (i) assist in achieving ecologically sustainable development in the ACT by addressing issues associated with climate change; and
6 7		(ii) promote commitment to action in the ACT to address climate change; and
8		(iii) promote community understanding about issues of climate change; and
20 21		(iv) encourage energy efficiency and conservation in the ACT; and
22 23 24		(v) promote action in the ACT that is consistent with national and international schemes designed to address climate change; and

3 4	Dictionary
