Gaming Machine (Allocation) Amendment Bill 2003

A Bill for

An Act to amend the *Gaming Machine Act 1987*

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **1 Name of Act**

2 This Act is the *Gaming Machine (Allocation) Amendment Act 2003*.

3 **2 Commencement**

4 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

5 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on
6 the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

7 **3 Act amended**

8 This Act amends the *Gaming Machine Act 1987*.

9 **4 Conditions for issue of licences—gaming machines**
10 **Section 18 (2) and (3)**

11 *substitute*

12 (2) A licence must not be issued for premises to which a general licence
13 applies—

14 (a) if the premises contain at least 12 rooms that are for use as
15 residential accommodation for lodgers—in relation to more
16 than 10 gaming machines (whether class B or class C gaming
17 machines, or any combination); and

18 (b) if the premises do not contain rooms that are for use as
19 residential accommodation for lodgers or contain less than 12
20 of those rooms—in relation to more than 2 gaming machines
21 (whether class B or class C gaming machines, or any
22 combination).

23 (3) A licence must not be issued for premises to which an on licence
24 applies in relation to more than 2 gaming machines (whether class B
25 or class C gaming machines, or any combination).

- 1 (4) A licence must not be issued for premises to which an on licence
2 applies unless the on licence is stated to be for the primary purpose
3 of running a ‘tavern/bar’.

4 **5 Restriction on gaming machines**
5 **Section 23B (2)**

6 *substitute*

- 7 (2) The commission must not issue, or vary, a licence if this would
8 result in the total number of gaming machines exceeding—
9 (a) 5 008 in clubs; or
10 (b) 5 200 on licensed premises.
