3B Littering from motor vehicle

- (1) A person must not drop litter from a motor vehicle that is in a public place.
- 6 Maximum penalty:
 - (a) if the litter is likely to cause injury to people or damage to property—50 penalty units;
 - (b) in any other case—10 penalty units.
- 10 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply if litter is dropped from a public vehicle by a passenger in the vehicle.
- 12 (3) An offence against subsection (1) is a strict liability offence.
- 13 (4) To remove any doubt, for the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999*, section 36, an offence against subsection (1) is an infringement notice offence involving a vehicle.
