
MATSON STREET

Phillip Henry MATSON (1884-1928)

Sportsman. At the 1905 Australasian Championships in Melbourne he won the 220 yards breaststroke event. He set a World record of 3 minutes and 14 seconds time for this event in 1908. He turned professional in 1909. He played Australian Rules in Western Australia and South Australia from 1904-1918. He became coach of the East Perth Football Club in 1918. Strengthened by his recruitment of champion players, East perth won seven premierships between 1919 and 1927.
