Vernon Seymor Ransford (1885-1958) Cricketer and Cricket Administrator. He made his debut for Victoria in 1904. he played five Test matches against England in 1907-08. He topped the state batting averages 5 times from 1905-10. He served as administrator with the Victorian Crickter's Association for 40 years.

Cricketer. -A right handed batsman with a sound defence and free style. Impaired health, which necessitated an operation, handicapped him while in England with the 1880 team. In the first ever Test in England at The Oval he scored 11 but did not represent Australia again.

**BUSHBY PLACE** 

Charles Harold Bushby (1887-1975)

Cricket Administrator. He was a member of the Board of Control of International Cricket in 1919 and president of the North Tasmania Cricket Association for 50 years. He was the manager of the Australian Test Team touring the United Kingdom in 1934.

Frederick Myles Coverdale (1885-1958)

Sculler. His father gave him the love of the river and encouraged his aquatic pursuits. On leaving school he was apprenticed to a Hobart ship builder. He first raced in 1902 for the Hobart Rowing Club. He excelled in the single sculls being the Champion of Hobart from 1906-12 and of Launceston from 1909-13. He won the Australian Single Sculls title in 1913 before retiring. He was the founding member for the Sandy Bay Rowing Club in 1910 and contributed as a coach and supporter.

He represented the ACT on six occasions one was against the World XI at Manuka in 1972. He transferred to Queanbeyan in 1977-78, and was a member of the premership side 1980-83 and secretary of the club 1983-84. His career with Easts Rugby Union Club spanned 20 years.


Keith Carnall (1901-1977)

He played in the first Australian Capital Territory Championships in 1924. In 1928 he represented Canberra in tennis against the Sydney Metropolitan Team.


